Authenticity

- Read each set subject description carefully and stay within the guideline (don't give assessors the option of saying it doesn't comply)
- Where the description says things like it should represent the reality of the scene then best not to add a mountain, replace the sky or remove an annoying bird or body etc
- If it is Open or one of the more creative topics you can do all those things and more
 - But if you are adding something it must have been your image in the first instance not an internet sourced one (eg if replacing the sky it should be a sky you took, if adding a texture it should be your texture etc)
- But even in Open or Creative you cannot use Al-generated or third party images that are not yours
 - You can use filters or actions or whatever to modify your own original image(s)
