It would  be nice to have a little more room around the main subject to avoid that cramped feel. The colour although slightly muted fits the film  type feel but to me, also lacks sharpness. | All Dressed up for Festival<br>Fun                          | Looking very steampunkish, a genre very active in my area and one I enjoy shooting. These two certainly seem to enjoy the limelight. I love the lighting here as whatever its source, has illuminated the subjects (especially her) with a glow. Maybe the Parasole played a part here. IMO this is also cropped or shot to tight. I would have liked to have seen the gentleman's entire hand within the frame as this adds un-necessary weight to that point which competes for attention with the main subject. Also, I believe that because the gentleman is the closest subject, the focal point should have been on him. At the moment he is a touch soft and she is sharp. A great subject to photograph but this needs some carefull consideration. Please have another go if the opportinity presents itself.   | Merit               |

Judging from the expression, this looks like is spontaneous act, possibly directed at someone. I love the mischievous nature of this image but think it could be improved with a little crop. Taking into account the story, are we able to enhance the feel with a simple crop? I would say "yes". Let's say you cropped out from just below the shirt down. This would centre and strengthen the story to where it matters. Another thing I can suggest is to add a touch more room to the right-hand side. This would add a little more balance as well as more of the water that shoots in that direction. A great moment caught.   | Merit               |
| Beach Hop Dancers   | The highlight of 2018 for me was dancing Rock n Roll in front of 1700 people in our local Dancing with the Stars competition. Considering myself and dance just don't mix, it was a significant achievement to have placed third. With that said, I can relate to this image. I would have liked to have seen smiling happy faces as they twirled and performed for what was surely an appreciative crowd. I've always though this an interesting filter effect and while these types of filters are not my thing, I believe is has some merit here. My suggestion would have been to apply the filter to the couple only giving the feeling of a couple totally animated, focused on their own little world as they danced through the reality that surround them. I different take I know but a case for more creative use of these effects. Such a colourful scene offers you opportunities to experiment further so always try to think past the obvious.  | Accepted            |
| Fishing on a Winters Day                                    | This reminds me of the west coast beaches which always seem so unforgiving. With such wild and hostile seas, I think your choice of black n white runs well with the story. It certainly aids the wintery feel. From a compositional point of view, I have some suggestions for improvement. The first is to be careful with objects entering the frame that in odd places such as on the right side, two thirds up. A careful crop or the patch tool could fix this. Also, a crop to aid in providing a more definite visual lead in line from the bottom left into the fisherman. To do this, I would take some off the top as well as the left until the line of the wharf intersects the bottom left hand corner. This would improve the composition, balance and retain the aspect ratio. One last point, The right-hand fisherman. For me, having his fishing rod coming out of the back of his head looks a little odd. Some small fixed could elevate this image and make it much strong. Areas such as this always seem to have a defined clarity, a pureness of colour as is visible in this image. To me the highlights have been clipped a touch too much and would have loved to have seen the detail. I tend to meter towards the highlights and then pull the shadows back in Photoshop. One suggestion is a crop with the idea of having both the outside edges of the mountain entering the frame from on or close to the bottom corners. This help create a lead in for the eye through to the climbers more effectively. Amazing location and I envy you.  |                     |
| Hot Glass   | A recent ty program based around competitive glass making made me realize what great photographic opportunities like within the art of glass making. I enjoy the glass mimicking what could be flowing honey as it manipulated into whatever shape is handler desires. It's never easy judging such images as things like freedom of movement, environmental restrictions and safety issues are essential elements we are unaware of so forgive me. For me there are some issues here that need addressing. May I suggest moving around to the left could have reaped a better compositional result. As it sits the metal rods cut through faces and divide the image. While I enjoy the slight gritty feel this has, its offset by being out of focus. The focus point appears to be forward of the man in the singlet. Be careful with moving subjects as this can quickly render a focus point obsolete.  | Accepted            |
